CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2019

From the flagship GeoCom event and our national conferences, to engagement with government, our early years career network and our ongoing curation of the UK Gemini standard, AGI's successes in 2019 were many and varied. In a year of continued political, economic and technological change, these are a huge achievement for a small organisation with limited resources. To ensure that our Association fulfils its potential and continues to thrive, it is essential that our ambition is clear and relevant. After much reflection the AGI Council developed a new mission to guide us into the 4th decade of the our organisation. In early 2020 we unveiled our new mission statement and purpose: to be a thriving UK Geospatial Community, actively supporting a sustainable future. To achieve this we will work closely with our members, partners and supporters delivering benefits through three pillars of activity: Nurturing and connecting active GI communities; Supporting career and skills development for GI professionals; and thought leadership to inspire future generations.

In 2019 the AGI signed an MoU with the Knowledge Transfer Network's Special Interest Group for Geospatial. The agreement sees AGI become a key partner of KTN's new Geospatial Insights Special Interest Group (SIG) which supports the geospatial community to accelerate innovation and grow the UK economy. Through cross-sector and multidisciplinary workshops and events, the Geospatial Insights SIG will explore how emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence, cloud computing, augmented and virtual reality interact with location and earth observation data to grow the economy and realise societal impact. AGI will use its extensive network, including its newsletter and other member communications, to support KTN in promoting its technology workshops, cross sector events, investment training programmes, maths study groups and company consultations.

Throughout the year AGI continued to benefit from its strong relationship with the Royal Geographical Society with IBG (RGS). Our Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the RGS aims to develop joint geospatial advocacy and support skills development for the geographic information professional. This collaboration has allowed us to work towards our common goals and maximise our impact by drawing on the skills and heritage of both organisations for the mutual benefit of a larger pool of members.

In October we held a very successful GeoCom conference at the Royal Society under the title of "Hitting Net Zero: Applying geospatial to global challenges". Our organising committee worked hard to deliver an outstanding event for our members with high profile speakers from across government, academia and industry. We were pleased to host a round table discussion on growth opportunities for geospatial chaired by the Geospatial Commission at GeoCom19, as part of their engagement for a new National Geospatial Strategy. Participants, who represented a variety of public and private sector organisations, contributed their thoughts on what should be the focus of the Commission's activities. In addition to GeoCom, our National Groups continued to deliver a strong programme of events and activities to provide opportunities to our members in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

Engagement with the Geospatial Commission is a key activity and our Council Members have maintained close links with this expert committee which is part of the Cabinet Office. We were greatly encouraged to be named a key stakeholder in the skills debate by the Geospatial Commission in its annual plan. We are looking forward to working with the Commission and others to help create an evidence-base for geospatial skills and the expansion of established skills development programmes.

Our members are the heart and life of the AGI and are core to the success of our thriving community. I am constantly amazed by the breadth, scale and diversity of work that is undertaken throughout our geospatial community. From health, to defence, to environment or construction, the application of location based information can be found everywhere. Thank you to all our hard working volunteers, contributors and supporters. Without these amazing individuals and organisations the AGI would not be the success it is today.
