CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2020

I am happy to present the Association for Geographic Information's annual accounts for 2020. Like many other organisations around the world in 2020, the AGI's operations were restricted by the impact of Covid-19 on society. Also like many other organisations, the AGI responded to this challenge with measures to weather the on-going restrictions of the pandemic, as well as secure the long term success and sustainability of the Association.

The impact of the pandemic came at a time when we, as an Association, were poised to take the next steps of the organisational transformation we announced with our new mission statement in 2019. As a result of this we were fortunate in having a clear vision for our success. This allowed us to shift our activity quickly to other measures that would contribute to this vision. We shifted our focus from short term membership development activity, which was hampered by the necessary pandemic restrictions, to long term cost consolidation and investment in our communications infrastructure. This decision resulted in the procurement of a new AGI back office secretariat contract in August and the development of a new AGI website and membership portal which went live in April 2021. These measures provide us with the underlying operational and communication infrastructure upon which to build future membership activity post-pandemic.

While making the long term changes described above, we also took steps to ensure continued value to AGI members in 2020, to support membership retention and secure sustainable cash flow. The primary method for this was to shift our traditional engagement activities online. This decision meant that we were able to deliver AGI GeoCommunity, AGI Cymru, multiple Early Career Network events and our AGM, to members using online tools, despite the restrictions of the pandemic. The reduction in revenue from online delivery was offset by reduced cost of sales. As a result of these measures we are pleased to report that the pandemic had limited negative effects on the AGI's membership levels and financial viability in 2020.

The operational highlight of the year was our three-day online thought leadership conference, AGI GeoCommunity, which ran in 2020 under the theme of "Sustainable (R)Evolution". This conference built on the themes of sustainability covered in our 2019 event and helped us develop further our new mission, to be a thriving geospatial community, building a sustainable future. Despite being online, the event was well attended and received very positive feedback from attendees. As in previous years, the event was elevated through an "outside-in" approach that saw inspirational speakers from outside the GI community share thought provoking and relevant content with attendees.

As ever, a key tenet of our success in 2020 was our thriving national groups in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. As per previous years our AGI Scotland annual event was extremely well attended. This was our last face to face event of 2020 and was run under the theme of "Sustainable Scotland". Logistical challenges meant that unfortunately we were unable to run an AGI annual event in Northern Ireland, however this group is now poised to build on the learning from other parts of the AGI in delivering events online and return with an event in 2021. AGI Cymru ran as a successful online event to explore the role of analytics in sustainability.

2020 also saw strategic changes to our Early Careers Network (ECN) and Standards working group. A change of leadership and Council sponsorship for ECN supported the delivery of a renewed programme of early career online engagement including a successful webinar on "building a career in Geospatial". Rationalisation of our Standards working group's operations combined with a named AGI Council standards lead, has resulted in improved engagement in UK GI standards development, an area which is of prime importance to many of our members.

We recognise that in an increasingly digital world, the AGI is one part of a diverse geospatial ecosystem that crosses multiple sectors and domains. To thrive in this ecosystem, it is important to be connected and to influence. To achieve this the AGI took steps to develop our network with existing and new strategic partnerships. Our partnership with the RGS with IBG continues to flourish and explore themes around geospatial skills to the mutual benefit of both communities. We were happy to be able to work closely with our new strategic partner, the Knowledge Transfer Network's Special Interest Group for Geospatial and to support their Power of Place webinar series through presentations, moderation and contribution to the publication. The AGI also signed new Memorandums of Understanding with the Chartered Institute of Civil Engineering Surveyors and the Australian Surveying and Spatial Sciences Institute, both of which have resulted in new activity to develop mutual membership value.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2020

A key industry development in 2020 was the launch of the UK Geospatial Strategy 2020-2025 by the Cabinet Office Geospatial Commission in June. We were encouraged to be named as a stakeholder to the Geospatial Commission and delighted that our Early Career's Network was identified as an initiative to inspire the next generation of geospatial practitioners in the UK. Engagement with the Geospatial Commission is a key activity and our Council Members have maintained close links with this expert committee which is part of the Cabinet Office. We look forward continuing to work with the Commission and others to help create an evidence-base for geospatial skills and the expansion of established skills development programmes.

Whilst 2020 was a challenging year for all of us, I continue to be encouraged, amazed and inspired by the contributions made by our diverse and thriving geospatial community. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our members and partners for their continued support for our mission. I believe that the strategic changes we have made in 2020 lay the foundations for us to truly thrive together, once pandemic restrictions are eased. This will allow us to take the promotion of location based information to the next level and strive for the sustainable future that we all believe in.
