3 Richard: Comms update

GeoBusiness activities:

The AGI Award winners and presenters have been decided. The rational for Chair's Award winner (David Henderson) is to be written down to ensure future consistency of judgement. As there was only one nomination for Ethics with Impact, this will not be awarded this year. Each winner will have 5 minutes to present their work.

AGI is sharing a stand (including a mini-theatre) with CICES, TSA and RICS.

Several Council members are involved in sessions.

After GeoBusiness, the primary comms focus will be GeoCom.

There was a discussion about lapel pins which George will follow up.

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4 Alan: Finance

The 2023 accounts are complete pending final signature. £50k has been moved to savings and £73k remains in the bank.

Since January income has been up and costs down against budget, but some invoices remain outstanding. We are broadly on track.

Alan has reviewed the Finance Handbook. Some associated changes will be required regarding the Council Handbook.

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We don't yet have consistent event pricing across UK nations. AGI Scotland has raised a query about retaining surpluses from Scottish events. This will be tabled as part of the business planning meeting.

5 Peter: AGI/RGS meeting update

Peter and Fergus met with Nigel Clifford, Joe Smith and Catharine Souch. The discussion began with outlining the respective positioning and challenges of the two member organisations, both of which are undergoing strategic reviews – AGI focusing more on 'community', RGS on achieving impact through 'low ego partnerships' and professionalism. Three areas of shared opportunity were identified for continued exploration:

- Stronger CPD collaboration
- A modern, sustainable model for membership organisations
- Engaging across associations to present a unified message to government.

Peter concluded that this meeting has provided an opportunity for a very open dialogue about future models of collaboration. Denise agreed that a wider cross-organisational discussion, including the Geospatial Commission, is required to achieve a coordinated message.



6 John: ICT update

The new website is in progress. It is good to go once the updated mission statement has been confirmed and national chairs have been consulted. It will previewed to Council before going live in 2-3 weeks.

Good progress is being made on the new Microsoft estate.

- Permissions will be set against Owner, Member and Guest categories.
- After some discussion it was agreed that Network (free) members will be able to access the estate
 for volunteering activities but not to have access to AGI Network resources. A code of conduct is
 required to commit all users (notably free- or non-AGI members) to good behaviour prior to
 access.
- Each workspace will have a SharePoint area with controlled permissions.
- Annual auditing will be undertaken to against member turnover to ensure removal of records in line with GDPR obligations.
- Once migration is complete, no further activity should take place on Basecamp.
- Aliases (e.g. Chair, Hon Sec) will be linked to personal email addresses.

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7 Vida and Liz: GeoCom planning

The Speakers sub-committee has agreed a structure for the day. There will be 4 categories: innovation, communities, thought leadership and Geo6.

It was agreed to accept the RGS venue charge of circa £5k, equivalent to 2023. Peter said that RGS should be recognised as a sponsor as it provides a subsidy on its normal commercial rates for the event.

The is no clear consensus for the conference theme, which in its current form is felt to be too generic. The GeoCom Working Group will approve a recommended theme next week and Council subsequently notified.

8 National Groups update

Sara reported that preparations are well underway for the AGINI conference. 9 sponsors have been confirm and 70 registrations received to date.

7 responses have been received following a call for more AGINI board members.

9 Fergus: AGI Networks

Fergus will share the Networks TOR once developed. He suggested that a minimum of 4 or 5 members is required for each Network. Peter urged that all Networks should be encouraged to produce outputs and not simply become talking shops.

The EO Network will be announced at GeoBusiness. Dan Wicks (of GHG Satellite) is willing to chair.

The 3D Network is in gestation. Fergus, Mark and Steve Croney will take this forward.
